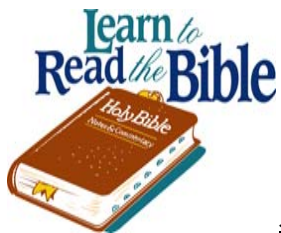

19-20"Oh, so you're a \_\_\_\_\_! Well, tell me this: Our ancestors \_\_\_\_\_ God at this mountain, but you Jews insist that Jerusalem is the only place for worship, right?"

21-23"\_\_\_\_\_ me, woman, the time is coming when you Samaritans will worship the Father \_\_\_\_\_ here at this mountain nor there in Jerusalem. You worship guessing in the dark; we Jews worship in the clear \_\_\_\_\_ of day. God's way of \_\_\_\_\_ is made available through the Jews. But the time is coming—it has, in fact, come—when what you're \_\_\_\_\_ will not matter and where you go to worship will not \_\_\_\_\_.

23-24"It's who you \_\_\_\_\_ and the way you \_\_\_\_\_ that count before God. Your worship must engage your \_\_\_\_\_ in the pursuit of truth. That's the kind of people the Father is out looking for: those who are simply and honestly \_\_\_\_\_ before him in their worship. God is sheer being itself—\_\_\_\_\_.
