Activities Scheduled Each Habitat Work Day

Day 1 – Saturday, Sept 12 (3 volunteers needed)

Clear crawlspace and paint foundation
Set floor joists
Lay floor decking
Sheath panels and run exterior walls
Run interior walls
Tie walls together, straighten and brace
Install lower porch package

Day 2 – Saturday, Sept 19 (2 volunteers needed)

Prep and run trusses
Install windows and trim packages
Install interior framing – wind bracing, deadwood, attic stairs
Deck roof
Install sub-fascia, barge rafters and drip edge
Felt roof
Set up siding – trim, corner boards, skirt board, drip cap and starter strip

Day 3 – Saturday, Sept 26 (3 volunteers needed)

Shingle roof
Insulate walls and ceiling
Begin siding and caulking
Install underlayment in kitchen, dining room and bathroom

Day 4 – Saturday, Oct 3 (no volunteers needed)

Finish insulation
Finish siding and caulking
Begin painting exterior – siding, foundation, and window trim
Build side porch and ramp

Day 5 – Saturday, Oct 10 (3 volunteers needed)

Finish exterior painting
Begin interior painting
Install baseboard, window sills and miscellaneous interior trim
Install kitchen cabinets and countertops
Begin soffit and fascia

Day 6 – Sunday, Oct 18 (no volunteers needed)

Touch up exterior painting
Finish soffit and fascia
Finish interior painting
Install porch railings

Day 7 – Sunday, Oct 25 (no volunteers needed)

Install doorknobs and bathroom hardware
Clean house interior
Touch up interior painting
Complete miscellaneous items

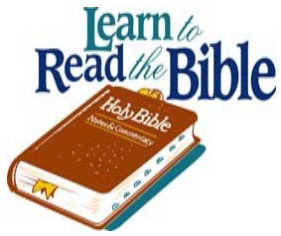

is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization that works in partnership with the Fulton County Juvenile Court to identify and address the myriad of complex needs of the youth and families under the court's jurisdiction.

The Juvenile Justice Fund's (JJF) **Center to End Adolescent Sexual Exploitation**, also known as CEASE, is one of the nation's most aggressive programs in combating the Commercial Sexual Exploitation of Children (CSEC).

In 1999, through the passion, hard work and collaboration of several women leaders, including key members of the Juvenile Justice Fund, Fulton County Juvenile Court and The Atlanta Women's Foundation, **Angela's House** came into existence. These community stakeholders set out to raise awareness of the problem of child commercial sexual exploitation in Atlanta, which had not been publicly addressed up to that point, to change legislation to reflect the criminality of the pimping of children and raise funds to secure a facility that would provide safe, stable housing and appropriate treatment for girls on the street who had been victims of commercial sexual exploitation. In answers to their prayers, a generous woman donated **Angela's House**. Please give generously. Thanks!
