## Activities Scheduled Each Habitat Work Day

### Day 1 – Saturday, Sept 12 (3 volunteers needed)

Clear crawlspace and paint foundation  
Set floor joists  
Lay floor decking  
Sheath panels and run exterior walls  
Run interior walls  
Tie walls together, straighten and brace  
Install lower porch package

### Day 2 – Saturday, Sept 19 (2 volunteers needed)

Prep and run trusses  
Install windows and trim packages  
Install interior framing – wind bracing, deadwood, attic stairs  
Deck roof  
Install sub-fascia, barge rafters and drip edge  
Felt roof  
Set up siding – trim, corner boards, skirt board, drip cap and starter strip

### Day 3 – Saturday, Sept 26 (3 volunteers needed)

Shingle roof  
Insulate walls and ceiling  
Begin siding and caulking  
Install underlayment in kitchen, dining room and bathroom

### Day 4 – Saturday, Oct 3 (no volunteers needed)

Finish insulation  
Finish siding and caulking  
Begin painting exterior – siding, foundation, and window trim  
Build side porch and ramp

### Day 5 – Saturday, Oct 10 (3 volunteers needed)

Finish exterior painting  
Begin interior painting  
Install baseboard, window sills and miscellaneous interior trim  
Install kitchen cabinets and countertops  
Begin soffit and fascia

### Day 6 – Sunday, Oct 18 (no volunteers needed)

Touch up exterior painting  
Finish soffit and fascia  
Finish interior painting  
Install porch railings

### Day 7 – Sunday, Oct 25 (no volunteers needed)

Install doorknobs and bathroom hardware  
Clean house interior  
Touch up interior painting  
Complete miscellaneous items  
Rake and clear lot  
Landscape

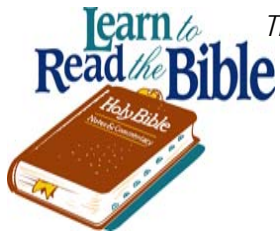

### The Most Important Command

<sup>34-36</sup> When the Pharisees heard how he had bested the \_\_\_\_\_, they gathered their forces for an assault. One of their religion \_\_\_\_\_ spoke for them, posing a question they hoped would show him up: " \_\_\_\_\_, which command in God's Law is the most important?"

<sup>37-40</sup> Jesus said, "'Love the \_\_\_\_ your God with all your \_\_\_\_\_ and prayer and intelligence.' This is the most \_\_\_\_\_, the first on any list. But there is a \_\_\_\_\_ to set alongside it: 'Love \_\_\_\_\_ as well as you love \_\_\_\_\_.' These two commands are pegs; \_\_\_\_\_ in God's Law and the Prophets hangs from them."
